The New Zealand Permanent Mission to the United Nations, accredited to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to recall that on 22 August 2008 the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf (the Commission) adopted recommendations regarding New Zealand's partial submission to the Commission.

The Permanent Mission wishes to inform the Secretary-General that on 12 September 2018 by the enclosed circular letter dated 12 September 2018, New Zealand formally established the outer limits of its continental shelf in our national law. These outer limits are established in accordance with the recommendations adopted by the Commission on 22 August 2008 in respect of New Zealand's partial submission.

The Permanent Mission has the pleasure to inform the Secretary-General that the geodetic data permanently describing the outer limits of its continental shelf (see articles 76, paragraph 9, and article 84, paragraph 2, of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea 1982 (the Convention))

The Permanent Mission recalls that according to article 76, paragraph 10 of the Convention, recommendations shall be final and binding. In this regard, the Permanent Mission wishes to note that it has no prejudice to the outcome of future continental shelf delimitation negotiations in the South Fiji Basin, with Fiji and the Kingdom of Tonga, and possibly France (in respect of New Caledonia) in the area of the Three Kings Ridge.

The Permanent Mission requests that the Secretary-General of the United Nations give due publicity to this note in accordance with article 86, paragraph 3, and article 84, paragraph 2 of the Convention.

The New Zealand Permanent Mission to the United Nations takes this opportunity to renew to the Secretary-General of the United Nations its thanks for your kind consideration.
