participated in the pro-ect?s activities and en9a9ed in debates around the A9enda +; 0; # and more than ten or9ani! ations were involved in producin9 the outputs of the pro-ect\$ Actions in Aebanon#<ordan#Tunisia and "orocco were or9ani!ed to influence policy chan9e accordin9 to , ro-ect participants included *4Os# political parties# academics and trade unions\$ The pro-ect had a comprehensive model of implementation which contained two components\$ The first aimed at providin9 a space for all pro-ect participants to evaluate and discuss socio>economic reform initiatives# especially in the areas of 4DG 3 (poverty eradication)# 4DG = (economic 9rowth)# and 4DG 3; (ineCualities)# in their respective countries\$ National reports were discussed throu9h national dialo9ues or9ani!ed in each country# and a re9ional report combinin9 all these analyses was published\$ The national dialo9ues were or9ani!ed over a period of two days and throu9h a collaboration between ANND and one of their local partners\$

The second component aimed at developin9 a 9uidebook on the new A9enda +; 0; # containin9 an e%planation of the different 9oals and tar9ets (4DGs 3# =# 3; and 31) # as well as three different booklets tar9etin9 three different types of stakeholders@*4Os# parliamentarians and trade unions\$ (ive capacity development workshops were or9ani!ed in the different countries followin9 a re9ional validation workshop\$

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As mentioned earlier# the difficult internal climate in '9ypt led to plannin9 activities with AOE/ and linkin9 these efforts with their on9oin9 en9a9ement with the Aea9ue of Arab 4tates\$ Dhile it seems that this delay and the issues related to the implementation of the activities could have been anticipated# the solution found turned out to be an efficient and beneficial approach to ensurin9 constructive implementation of all pro-ect activities and ensure their sustainability\$ A lon9 report of the 9uidebook validation workshop was produced that detailed the contents of the sessions and included a recap of the post>workshop evaluation that seemed to show a hi9h level of appreciation by the participants\$

.n other countries such as "orocco or Tunisia# while the 9overnments are interested in en9a9in9 on the 4DGs# they may be doin9 so without a comprehensive and inclusive approach accordin9 to some pro-ect participants# especially 9iven the unendin9 social tensions and unrest in some re9ions\$ One of the participants even mentioned@8when the 9overnment has an international partner# they are under pressure to be inclusive# but when they don?t# they don?t bother:# indicatin9 that the 6N/ process is more about preparin9 a positive presentation than under9oin9 a critical e%ercise\$

(inally#the constructive links that have been built over the years and stren9thened thanks to this pro-ect?s activities with the &N?s ' 4*DA and the AA4 can contribute to an improved levera9in9 of influence towards 9overnments in ensurin9 that national plans are set>up in an inclusive and participatory manner\$

There was a clear added value to &ND' (fundin9\$ As mentioned by multiple pro-ect stakeholders# several &N a9encies are workin9 on implementation of specific 4DGs separately# leavin9 civil society activists and 9overnment officials to find it difficult to prioriti!e or identify a ne%us amon9 all these different initiatives\$ ANND was able to avoid these issues because the &ND' (9rant supported a holistic and ri9hts>based approach to the 4DGs\$ promotin9 partnerships and cross>cuttin9 initiatives\$ y takin9 this approach# a stron9 syner9y was created between the &N>' 4*DA and the &ND' (>funded pro-ect# where the /e9ional *ommission contributed to several of the pro-ect?s activities at the national and re9ional levels\$

.n addition#the presence of a &N lo9o on pro-ect materials seems to have enhanced the credibility of the pro-ect\$ 4takeholders mentioned the value of &ND' (as a donor that is based in EeadCuarters#as opposed to the national offices of other &N a9encies\$ The importance of this distinction lays in the fact that the 9rant>makin9 process is different and that the &ND' (office is independent from the re9ional commission and main &N bodies dealin9 with followin9>up on 4DG implementation such as '4*DA and &ND,\$

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- (i) & e project was extremely relevant in t e c! rrent context of t e region4 y focusin9 on linkin9 the 9lobal sustainable development a9enda with policy reform debates in the re9ion# ANND was able to anchor the interest of a part of civil society and 9overnment entities in these thematic priorities and link them to the competin9 short>term priorities related to peace# security and refu9ee issues\$ The timeliness of the pro-ect and relevance of the materials produced provide a solid intersectional framework at the re9ional and national levels for stron9er in>depth en9a9ement on 4DG implementation\$ The activities and outputs are consistent with the outcomes laid out in the pro-ect document (demonstrated en9a9ement in public debate around the new sustainable development a9enda and improvement of strate9ic partnerships with trade unions# academia and the private sector)\$ Gender and disability mainstreamin9 were taken seriously and
