**Update on the activities of the Baltic Marine Environment Protection Commission – Helsinki

HELCOM Ministerial Meeting held in Brussels on 6 March 2018 will be based on scientific knowledge, including on climate change impacts as well as the water and ecosystems of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in particular SDG 14.

Current objectives on eutrophication, biodiversity, maritime activities and fisheries, the updated BSAP will have an increased focus on underwater noise, circular economy, as well as seabed damage and disturbance.
