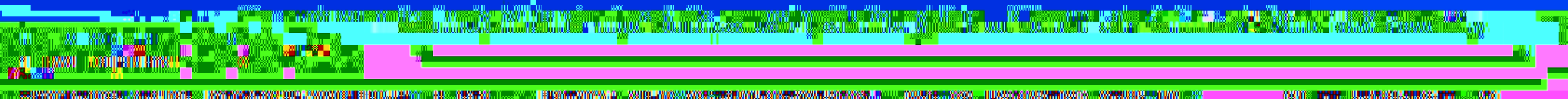




# Report Analysis
