

The Council postponed to a future session the election of one member from Asian States for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1995.

**INTERNATIONAL NARCOTICS CONTROL BOARD**

The following six members were elected for a five-year term beginning on 2 March 1995:

(a) Five members from among candidates proposed by Governments: Edward A. Babayan (Russian Federation), Mohamed A. Mansour (Egypt), António Lourenço Martins (Portugal), Oskar Schroeder (Germany) and Elba Torres Graterol (Venezuela);

(b) One member from among candidates proposed by the World Health Organization: Elisaldo Luiz de Araújo Carlini (Brazil).

(a) *African States* (three vacancies): ANGOLA, KENYA and UGANDA;

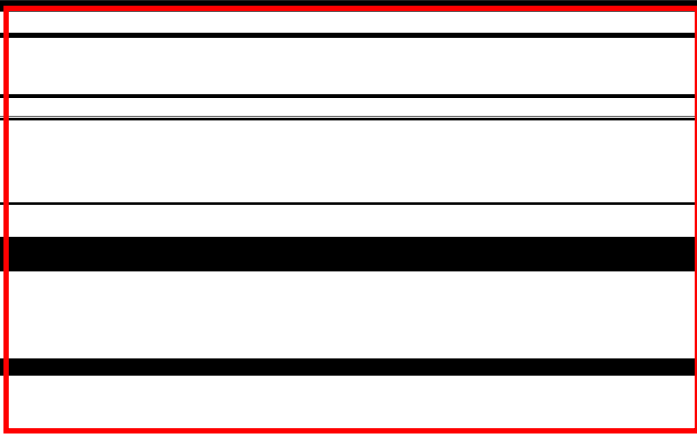
(b) *Asian States* (two vacancies): INDONESIA;

(c) *Eastern European States* (two vacancies): RUSSIAN FEDERATION;

(d) *Latin American and Caribbean States* (three vacancies): COLOMBIA and HONDURAS.

The Council postponed to a future session the nomination of one member from Asian States, one member from Eastern European States, one member from Latin American and Caribbean States and two members from Western European and other States for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1995.
