begins its work, the Virgin Islands Fifth Constitutional Convention will have a period of one year—July 23, 2007 to July 27, 2008 to adopt a deaft constitution. During this period, the public education project will focus on the actual deliberations of the body as its members consider distinct proposals which may be adopted in a constitution. It is envisioned that there will be a series of nublic meetings conducted throughout the learning which will keep the constitution in the forefront of public life and that again all media will be utilized to accomplish the project objectives. There has been a sentiment throughout the community that every effort must be made to keep the public engaged during the work of the convention, as this will increase the chances of a document which can meet public convention.
