The Permanent Mission of Madagascar to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Codification Division of the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs, and, with reference to its Note Verbale LA/COD/4 dated 9 April 2010, has the honour to inform it of measures taken by the Government of Madagascar to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives as well as missions and representatives with diplomatic status to international intergovernmental organizations.

The Permanent Mission of Madagascar would like to report that measures currently being taken by the Malagasy Government are consistent with article 22, paragraph 2, of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of 18 April 1961.

- Embassies and/or United Nations agencies determine the number of security personnel (National Police or Gendarmerie) that they deem necessary to ensure the security and safety of mission premises or diplomatic residences.
- Permanent contact is maintained between officials of the above-mentioned agencies and the embassies, which are kept informed of any major incidents (areas to be avoided, appropriate travel time).
