Belgium's contribution to the report requested in paragraph 11 of General Assembly resolution 65/29 of 6 December 2010

Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 650/29 the status of the Protocols Additional to the Geneva Conventions of 1949 darelating to the protection of victims of armed conflicts, Belgin would like first to refer tots 2008 contribution, summarized in the report of the Secretary-Geral (A/63/118). In that conbrution, which consolidated and supplemented its previous reports, Belgium easigned its active support of the report.

- x The development of international humanitarliand, especially with regard to limitation or prohibition of the use of conventional weapownsich cause unnecessary suffering or which are inherently indiscriminate and respect for that law;
- x The International Committee **the** Red Cross (ICRC) and its efforts on behalf of the victims of armed conflicts; and
- x National and international enforcement mercisms for violations of international humanitarian law.

Belgium also refers to its 2010 report, sum **zred** in the report of the Secretary-General for the period 2008 to August 2010 (A/65/138/Add.1), **which** pplements the comprehensive report of 2008.

Since that report, the mass teworthy events for Belgin have been the following:

- x Ratification of the Second Protocol to the rolention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Onflict on 13 October 2010;
- x Intensive work on preliminary draft lawærnending Belgian legislation on the implementation of international humanitarian lawcluding with respect to the protection of emblems; cooperation with theternational Criminal Courtrad the international criminal tribunals; and ratification, of 1 June 2010, of the amendments to the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Courtadopted at the Kampala Centence of 31 May 2010; all of these drafts have been submitted to the Government;
- x Preparations for and active participation in **thie**ty-first International Conference of the Red Cross and Red Crescent, including ottensarelated to the implementation of international humanitarian law;
- x Organization of an international workshop on the the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Courtadopted in Kampala in 2010; and
- x Establishment, within the framework Bélgium's Interministerial Commission for Humanitarian Law, of a prepacety mechanism for measures studible taken with a view to implementation of the 1954 Convention for thetEction of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict and the two Protocols theter in light of ratification of the Second Protocol.
