emphasis, in order to stress that States, the United Nations, and intergovernmental organizations are not only entitled but encouraged to make offers of assistance, while non-governmental organizations have a different nature and legal status. We suggest eliminating the distinction and providing instead that States, the United Nations, intergovernmental organizations, and non-governmental organizations “may” offer assistance to the affected State, in accordance with international law and applicable domestic laws. While there is no doubt that States, the United Nations, and intergovernmental organizations make offers of assistance
