Mr. Chairman,

Mr. Chairman,

The rule of law is a core principle of the international legal system. It is a principle that underpins the rule of law capacities at the national level, ensures an effective international legal system and addresses the needs of the international community. Its focus is on promoting the rule of law and ensuring that it is applied in a consistent manner, both at the national and international levels.

With the support of the United States, we believe that the United Nations should continue to provide technical assistance and capacity building to help countries enhance their rule of law capacities. This is a key element of the United Nations' commitment to the rule of law.

There is therefore a need for the United Nations to focus on promoting the exchange of good practices and the formulation of common policies. At the same time all actors must refrain from using force to all approaches, approaches that are beyond the scope of the United Nations' mandate.
