clear threat to international peace and security. Sanctions should not be considered for preventive measures. Besides, sanctions should only be applied in accordance to the UN Charter and relevant principles of international law.

4. Malaysia appreciates the report of the Secretary General on the Implementation of the provisions of the Charter of the UN related to assistance to third States affected by the application of sanctions, as contained in document A/69/119. We note the improvements by the Security Council in shifting from comprehensive economic sanctions to targeted sanctions. We believe this shift will help to minimise the potential negative impact on third States.

On the proposal to study the proper implementation of the Charter of the UN with respect to the functional relationship of its organs, we have seen the need for concrete proposals to be made for discussion. Many delegations continue to underscore that the General Assembly remains the chief deliberative, policy-making and representative
