Concerning the implementation of the Agreement between the United Nations and the United States of America regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations, we express our appreciation to the host country for its continued efforts for the timely issuance of entry visas to representatives of Member States and observers and encourage any possible further improvement.

We consider that obtaining suitable banking services is indispensable for the effective functioning of Permanent Missions; in this connection, we welcome the continuing efforts made by the host country and note that General Assembly resolution 68/306 adopted by consensus on 9 September 2014 requested the Secretary General to report on several aspects and that the General Assembly remains seized of the matter and will keep it under review as appropriate.

We fully endorse the conclusions and recommendations formulated by the Committee in its report. We remain convinced that the Committee is an important body that assists the membership of the Organisation by providing a forum where matters of concern can be communicated to the host country and which facilitates dialogue between the parties in a manner geared towards addressing these issues both constructively and effectively. We favour further consideration by the Committee of measures to make its work more effective.
