The Scope and Application of the

Statement by Mr. Andreas Mathfeldt Hovvik,

Mr. Chair,

This topic has been discussed since 2011 within the framework of the working group on the scope and application of the principle of non-refoulement. In the course of this process, the information provided by Member States to the Secretary-General on their national legal rules and judicial practice, clearly has revealed that there can be no impunity for crimes of such gravity that they represent a threat to the international community as a whole.

Norway considers the principle of non-refoulement to be a cornerstone of international law that atrocity crimes and other crimes covered by international jurisdiction do not go unpunished.
