Unofficial Translation

Mr. Chairman,

Switzerland believes that the Articles on the protection of persons in the event of disasters are an important step to facilitate international cooperation in disaster.

Next to reflecting existing rights and obligations, they include innovative provisions, such as those mentioning the importance of upholding humanitarian principles and considering the needs of the most vulnerable when responding to disasters. Similarly, Switzerland agrees to consider human dignity as the guiding principle for any action to be taken in relation to disaster risk reduction and response.

Nevertheless, Switzerland notes that the relevant norms need to be more precise and detailed to ensure that they can be smoothly applied.

As previously noted, Switzerland has particular concerns concerning the ambiguity related to the interplay between International Humanitarian Law and the Articles. The Special Rapporteur has made amendments in the attempt to clarify this issue.
