to submit a report on this issue biennially. The same applies to OP5, which contains the associated request for a briefing by the Secretary-General on this issue to the Special Committee at its next session.

- 4. OP 6 (a) sets out the subtopic for the next thematic debate to be held during the next session, "Exchange of information on State practices regarding the use of conciliation", based on the recommendation of the Special Committee as contained in paragraph 61 of its report.
- 5. OPs 12-19 concerning the *Repertory* and the *Repertoire* replicate verbatim the recommendations contained in paragraph 77 of the report of the Special Committee, except for OP 14, where new language is added to express appreciation to contributions made by Member States other than those made to the trust funds.

6. Last it should be noted that different views still exist on PP17 and OP1. Desnite the efforts

made in the past weeks through informal consultations and bilateral discussions, we have not been able to reach consensus on this issue. Therefore, I believe that the only feasible way is to follow the views of the majority and to submit the current version of the draft resolution to the Sixth Committee for further action.
