Distinguished delegates, by its resolution 686 (VII) of 5 December 1952, the General Assemblymandated the SecretaryGeneralto undertake the publication of the Repertoire of the Rectice of the Security Councils one of the ways and means for making the evidence of customary international law more readily available. Since the first volume was published in 1954, the Repertoirehas provided an authoritative overview of the Council's contribution to the advancement of international law through the interpretation and application of the Charter and its own Provisional Rules of Procedure.
- 4. The rich content of the publication offers a unique insight into the 75-year history of the Council how the organhas given life to the Charter and wit has interpreted its powers and duties in the face of complex and evolving challenges to international peace and security. I invite legatesto visit the website of the Security Council where these proceedings have been duly chronicled in the Repertoire or the benefit of Member States and the public at large, made searchable and systematized both chronologically and by topic. The Repertoire constitutes a fundamental tool for Council and non Council membersalike, and for new delegates as well as for seasoned diplomats.
- 5. Distinguished delegates, over the past year, the Security Council Practices and Charter Research Branch continued to make significant progress in the preparation of the Repertoire. The Branch has successfully adapted its methodology to enable the contemporaneous coverage of the practice of the Council, a milestone in the 68year history of the publication.

6. The focus of our workin the past twelve monthswas the simultaneous preparation of the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> Supplements of the Repertoire, respectively covering the years 2019 and 2020. The initial parts of the 22 Supplement were made available in their advance form on the website of the Security Councilin August 2020. The remaining parts are being added to the website as they become avitable, all of which are expected to be online by

- 8. The objective of this ambitious schedule has been to ensure that the invaluable information on the practice of the Council is accessible the broader membership as soon as possible. In order to ensure the sustainability of the contemporaneous coverage of the Council'practice, additional financial support from Member States has been and remains absolutely critical.

In early January 2020, e launched a revampededition of the Highlights of Security Council actice covering the year 2019 As most of you know, the Highlights an annual online publication which has been published since 201, offering the most comprehensive snapshot of the activities of the Council lated to its agenda, meetings, decisions, voting patterns, and the work offs subsidiary bodies. With the help of an external consultant and building on our close collaboration with OICT and DPO, the 2019 edition of the ighlights features a new design and technological platform, providing enhanced interactivity and visualization of data. As in the past and subject to the availability of resources, we will continue to make more information products available to enable Member States and the public at large to become betteracquainted with the work of the Council and the central role it exercises in the maintenance of international peace and security.
