"International Law Commission, its importance and projection into the Future"

The International Law Commission enters its 8<sup>th</sup> decade of functioning in the coming years, while States and International Law needs to respond to new challenges and new requirements from societies increasingly interlinked thanks to instantaneous communication and decentralized exchange of information.

Since the inception of the ILC the world has changed, and relevant actors and proponents of International Law multiplied. Specialized International Organizations, informal initiatives among States and Civil Society interact with the traditional actors, contributing to both the development and fragmentation of International Law and the emergence of soft law instruments as a form of regulation on diverse global issues. Although State practice and international jurisprudence remain key sources for the work of ILC in many relevant topics of international law, a vibrant legal community pushes States and Courts to action.

Gender, migration, a key concern for environment protection and climate action, deeper implementation of human rights, involvement of local communities and traditional knowledge, although far from been new phenomena, may be some of the driving forces in the definition of priorities and content of legal initiatives in the context of progressive development of international law.

How should the International Law Commission adapt itself to a changing world? What are the topics that the ILC should address in the coming decade? What are the interactions to be improved in the work of the ILC? How can the States contribute t

Committee (and capitals) take to renew its interactions with the ILC?

All those questions remain open and the panelists will be invited to express their views on them and others that the audience may formulate.
