As disasters know no border and fect us all to a varying degree, though must strengthers ustainable partnership for disaster relief especially through the development of international law to enhance equate, effective and predictable collective responses and ensure humanitarianicato those in need in time of crise this end, we must also look beyond a particular crisis and adopt a forw bordking approach in formulating a legally binding instrument in this area. Thailand therefore reaffirms our support to the recommendation for the General Assembly to elaborate a convention on the basis of the Draft Articles and look forward to actively participating in further discussions on this issue.
