CHECK AGAINST DELIVERY

We note with appreciation the general observations given by the Special Rapporteur in his second report, including, importantly, that recognition is the essential condition for the existence of a general

methodology for the identification of general primples of law derived from national legal systems that is, first, determining the existence of a principle common to the principal legal systems of the world, and second, ascertaining the transposition of that principle to the international legal system.

With regard to the second category of general principles of law Zealand notes

the idea of paying attention to norms formed within the international legal system but considers that general principle flaw formed within the international legal system and rules of customary international law must be clearly distinguished.
