## Protection of Persons in the Event of Disasters

Statement by the Permanent Mission of the Saint Vincent and the Grenadines to the United Nations

Mr. President,

I have the honor to speak on behalf of the 33 member States of the Community of LatinAmerican and Caribbean States (CELAC).

CELAC takes note of the report of the Secret@spreral on "Protection of Personsni the Event of D4sasters", d , which contains the comments sent by States about the topic.

CELAC welcomes the inclusion of the item "Protection of Persons in the Event of Disasters" in the Agenda of the General Assembly's 73rd session and expresses its ppreciation to the International Law Commission for developing the Draft Articles, especially Eduardo Valence in a sporteur on the subject. His work demonstrates the topic's relevance in a world where disasters have become more frequenting the description.

Comprehensive and timely disaster risk management is of importance for effective preparedness, disaster risk reduction and mitigation, as well as the provision of adequate humanitarian responses, based onriddrid pof serving and protecting the people of our nations, placing the protection of their human dignity and webleing at the center of all humanitarian cooperation and assistance measulibies is especially important given that, despitesome multilateral agreements and a much larger number of bilateral treaties on mutual assistande legally relevant instruments are limited and not uniform We express our concern that protection from disasters is comprised of softaw, non-binding instruments elaborated at the intergovernmental level and also by private institutions and entities. In this regard, having an international legal framework becomes one of our main challenges that merits our consideration.

CELAC welcomes the adoption the General Assembly Resolution 119 adopted by consenson 9 December, 2021 In this regard, the members of CELAC recognize the valuable decision of the General Assembly to continue the consideration and study of the draft articles of the Internal 119

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in the debates in the Sixth Committee and the comments and observations received from Governments in the framework of a working group of the Sixth Committee, which will meet for four full consecutive days regulative seventyeighth and seventyeinth sessions of the Assembly.

The adoption of an international legal instrument would undoubtedly make a significant contribution to the harmonization of measures and protocols for effectively addressing thenderlying causes of disasters and the current high levels of vulnerability. It would also strengthen disaster risk reduction and management efforts at every stage, without prejudice to the bilateral and multilateral instruments on the matter to which estate already parties.

We hope that the Committee can have a productive dialdgring the Working Group deliberations the outcome of which would breported to the Sixth Committee at the severntion that session of the General Assembly, with a view to the Sixth Committee making a recommendation to the Assembly on any further action to be taken on the draft articles.
