

In this regard, the involvement of incumbent highnking officials should beaddresseith conformity with international law. By invoking universal jurisdiction, he exercise of criminal jurisdiction by national courts over highranking officials who enjoy immunity under international law violates one of the most fundamental principles of international law, namely the sovereignty of States.

The Movementhereforesubmits that the immunity of the States officials, which is deeply rooted in the Charter of the United Nations and firmly established in international law, should be fully respected.
