- 13. Part of the justice mechanisms efforts is the need to address the critical gap in the exercise of jurisdictions or lack thereof on sexual and gender -ba sed crimes. In the view of the delegation of Sierra Leone, member States can start preparatory work collectively on universal jurisdiction codification for sexual and gender -based crimes. In essence , we cooperate as Member States to ensure access to justice, and consequently remedies and assistance for survivors of sexual violence through the application of universal jurisdiction.
- 14. The delegation of Sierra Leone in line with paragraph 2 of General As sembly resolution 77/111 invites the International Law Commission to develop draft provisions on the application of universal criminal jurisdiction in relation to sexual and gender -based crimes. This request, we note , is made in accordance with the Statute and mandate of the International Law Commission and the aforementioned General Assembly resolution.
