We appreciate the broadsed recognition that inclusion—leaving no one behind—is central to both FID and post2015 conversations. However, while we recognize the considerable progress achieved since Monterremotably in having rates of extreme povertoo many HAVE been left behind in the path towards prosperifyocusing onriclusion and the needs of people in fragile situations must therefore be a key tenet of our approach to sustainable development

The sheer numbers are a call to action: about 1.2 billion people live in countries affected by fragility; and we know that conflict and violenaee the enemies of development and can also reverse years of development gaims flash. If we are to meet our commitment to eliminate extreme poverty by 2030, we must make a concerted effort to address the specific needs of fragile and conflictaffected sates

lasting development outcomes for our citizens, economies, and environment. With our collective eyes on the prize, we can rise above our differences — which undoubtedly exist — and find common ground on those principles and ideaswillahave most impact in reaching our shared vision .
