



Statement of Prof Dr Saleemul Huq, Director, International Centre for Climate Change and Development (ICCCAD), Independent University Bangladesh (IUB).

First, let me introduce myself and my relationshipy

I advise

the Chair (currently Bhutan) and the group on Adaptation, finance and loss and damage.

I have also been working with many universities in the LDCs through the LDC Universities Consortium on Climate Change (LUCCC) which is run by my Centre in Bangladesh.

I would like to provide three points for the consideration of the LDC5 preparatory meeting.

- 1. The LDC countries are amongst the most vulnerable to the negative impacts of climate change as recognised under Article 4 of the UNFCCC. Hence the issue of tackling climate change should be high on the agenda for the LDC5
- 2. The LDC Group under the leadership of Bhutan has set up three major climate change related initiatives to run until 2030. These are as follows:
 - a. Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Initiative (REEEI)
 - b. LDC Initiative for Effective Adaptation and Resilience (LIFE AR), and
 - c. LDC Universities' Consortium on Climate Change (LUCCC)
- 3. Going forward, every LDC should aim to graduate out of the LDC status and this will
