COVIDI9 is generating a further liquidity crisis, with huge negative socioeconomic pacts. SIDS revenue sources including remittances and tourism are badly hit adevastation to SIDS economies whose "tourism sector accounts for almost 30 per cent of their GDP". Due to sharpfalls in tourism revenues and remittances flows, SIDS are likely to experience paronounced contraction in 2020, further exacerbating their vulnerability to economic and climatic shocks

Disproportionately high debatervicing burdens of marS/IDSvill weaken their external balance, potentially increasing the likelihood of debt defauAs food importers, SIDS also face an immense challenge ensuring food security and nutritipa juggling feat that requires balancing precarious supply chains in many fronts including likelihood supplies SIDS respond COVIDI9.
