



President of Global Development Network (GDN)

Jean-Louis Arcand is the president of the Global Development Network. Born in Ebolowa (Cameroon) and a Canadian citizen, Jean-Louis Arcand is Professor in the Department of International Economics at the Graduate Institute in Geneva, which he joined in 2008. From 2017 to 2020 he was department chair, from 2012 to 2016 he was the founding Director of the Center for Finance and Development and from 2009 to 2012 he was chair of Development Studies. He is a Founding Fellow of the European Union Development Network (EUDN), a Senior Fellow at the Fondation pour les études et recherches en développement international (FERDI) and has been a Visiting Professor at Renmin University of China in Beijing, the Universidade Federal da Bahia and several universities in Africa and the Caribbean. He was assistant and then Associate Professor at the University of Montréal, and Professor at the Centre d'études et de recherches en développement International (CERDI). He holds a PhD in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), an MPhil from Cambridge University and a BA (high honors) from Swarthmore College. His research deals with the economics of development, impact evaluation, health, mathematical economics and political economy. He has consulted, among others, for the World Bank, the FAO, UNCTAD, the UNDP, the WHO, the Gates Foundation and several national governments.
