Peacebuilding Commision Burundi Configuration Second Session

Informal Meeting on the Monitoring and Tracking Mechanism of the Strategic Framework for Peacebuilding in Burundi Chairman's Summary Note 28 November 2007

- 1. The main purpose of the meeting was tonotoode the work on the development of a Monitoring and Tracking Mechanism (NM) for the Strategic Framework for Peacebuilding in Burundi.
- 2. The meeting was chaired by H.E. Mr. JoharL&vald, Permanent Representative (PR) of Norway to the United Nations. In his introdory remarks, Ambassador Løvald recalled that the Burundi formal CSM held on 20n&u2007 had agreed that a monitoring and tracking mechanism would be jointly deveed by Burundi and the Peacebuilding Commission to complement the Strategic Ferenork. He congratulated and thanked those who worked on the document, and commethed be Government of Burundi for its leadership in the process which involved cisoliciety and internation partners. He also thanked members of the PBC who devoted time to the exercise and acknowledged BINUB and the Secretariat's contribuilis. He recognised the presence of the ERSG in the meeting and thanked him for his presence.
- 3. Before opening the floor, he suggested a **few**hnical and editorial amendments to the negotiated text.
- 4. The delegations of Angola, Chain Jamaica, Pakistan and AJS congratulated the chair and the Government of Burundi for the work acceptished and indicated that they were happy with the improvements made on the document hey noted that they looked forward to concrete action and progress on the grounde delegation of the USA cautioned that the adoption of the document should not be indexed an arrival but a departure. He emphasized that the PBC and Burundi should adoptagmatic and flexible application of the mechanism. He also suggested that the information should also be considery the PBC. The delegation of China also underlined flexibility and the need to the mechanism after one year.
- 5. The PR of Luxembourg took the floor to exps his delegation's satisfaction with the progress made and congratulated the chairBarrodndian authorities. He underlined that the MTM was essential for thengagement between the PBC and Burundi, but that it has also implications beyond Burundi as it woluguide the Commission's engagement with other countries. While acknowling that the MTM would be improved and that it needed not be perfected at this stage; recalled that his delegation had consists flagged the importance of ensuring strong and positive contribution from civil society in the MTM. He deplored that this aspect swa ot sufficiently reflected in the MTM note and suggested to add language to that effect.
- 6. The PR of Burundi took the floor to say thetaere was no need to inucle such language as civil society organisations in Burundi alcepa participate at rany levels, and hoped that there was not need to reopen the discussion. The delegations of Angola and China called for a swift adoption of the document, with of ut there amendments. The Chair noted that Luxembourg had raised an important issue, bepteessed that he did not wish to re-open the
