## Background Note on the Snapshot of ODA disbursements related to Peacebuilding

- 1. The data on Official Development Assistance (ODA) is publicly available information, collected on an annual basis by the OECD as reported through their Creditor Reporting System. The present snapshot is an extract of the OECD database and visualizes data on donors, recipients and countries.
- 2. The Snapshot is dynamic and selecting sectors will highlight the donors for that sector and vice versa.

- 4. The information represents gross disbursements of ODA and <u>reflects actual spending</u> rather than commitments to spend money; while excluding debt repayments as reported to the OECD. They are expressed in millions of constant US\$ of 2017, which exclude inflation and exchange rate movements.
