This project aims to reduce and prevent tensions between populations displaced by the crisis in the West (NW) and South-West (SW) and host communities in the Littoral and West regions. The project will help improve protection and socio-economic integration for displaced persons, strengthen existing mechanisms to address inter-communal competition over access to basic services and livelihoods and enhance capacities for collaboration between communities and with local authorities. UN-Habitat

strengthening peacebuilding efforts through the leverage of private investment with a positive impact on the environment. UNDP and UN Women are the implementing partners.

It will adopt a community-driven approach with a focus on local chiefs, women's leadership and youth representatives with a view to reducing tensions and the risk of violence related to HLP disputes in the project target areas and FAO are the implementing partners.
