Background Paper on the Energy Sector in Guinea-Bissau

Introduction

- 1. The rehabilitation of basic urban infrastructure, especially power and water services, is paramount in the process of underpinning the economic recovery and political stabilization of the country and in the revitalization of the public and private sectors of the economy.
- 2. Prior to the 1998 conflict, Guinea-Bissau had one of the least developed infrastructure sectors in Africa. Only 2.6 percent of the population in Bissau had access to electricity, and 1.3 percent had access to water. The conflict caused the destruction of an

Master Plan, valued at 640,000 Euros and co-funded in the same amount by the World Bank under MIRP.
