Rationale for Re-setting Social Policies for Greater Resilience and Inclusion in the Post-COVID Era

The COVID-19 pandemic has turned into a multi-faceted social, economic and financial crisis, affecting peoples across regions. The virus has exposed the weakness of national health systems due to many years of under-investment, inadequacy of social protection systems and the acute vulnerability of marginalized communities and people living in poverty. The disruption of supply chains and projected fall in aggregate demand compounded by falling remittances and commodity prices, and job losses has pushed the world into recession with devastating consequences, particularly for middle- and low-income countries with limited capacities to respond.
