Summit. A stronger multilateral system where rules are applied universally is vital. Peace and security depend on adherence to international law and the UN Charter. Otherwise, we cannot address challenges from climate change to the risks of technology. We strongly support the Pact for the Future, and the accompanying Global Digital Compact and Declaration on Future Generation. They are critical building blocks for a stronger, future-ready multilateral system. Allow me to highlight some of Singapore's commitments.
