As regards new technologies, a state-o -the-art TV studio was launched in 6061, thanks to a generous donation by the ) etherlands, and has since been used or li#e and hybrid e#ents ocusing on the -!.s. A new system or the press to re+uest or renew their accreditation was also implemented. And, a new 7eye-le#el8 camera was installed at the center o the -ecurity Council Chamber, helping us deli#er the proceedings rom the room much more #i#idly.

Today, as we mark the opening day o this Committee, we also mark the annual &orld >ress 3reedom ! ay. ! espite the progress made in ensuring press reedom, 5ournalism still aces a multitude o threats, including an increasingly polluted in ormation en#ironment, where mis- and disin ormation run wild.

&e see a range o bad actors exploiting the sincere demand or in ormation on issues such as C V"! -1% or the climate emergency. They circulate alse, misleading or distorted content to warp our understanding o e#ents, and they are getting millions o #iews. -ome o these mis- and disin ormation actors aim to create con usion and a state o in ormation paralysis. \$thers are 5ust exploiting public sympathies or inancial gain.

The problem is more se#ere in the digital realm, where social media plat orms, as use ul as they are, and can be, were not designed to keep us in ormed, but rather, to attract ad#ertisers. They were designed to keep us engaged. Ampli ied by algorithms designed to grab attention, it is the most pro#ocati#e and outlandish posts that rise to the top o our eeds, #ery o ten including alse and misleading claims.

9et, digital plat orms can still ser#e humanity's best interests or peace, dignity, and the rule o law. This is our #ision. &e want to work toward a digital public s+uare that is inclusi#e and sa e or all and we wish that our digital commons are managed as a global public good.

To this goal, my team and ", as called or in the -ecretary-. eneral's \$ur Common Agenda 4eport, are working to de#elop a Code o Conduct or integrity in public in ormation. &e are 5ust at the beginning o this process and we will turn to you, distinguished delegates, or consultations in the next ew months.
