



STATEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE GROUP OF 77 AND CHINA  
BY H.E. AMBASSYOR KOLAKOVIC, PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE  
OF THE REPUBLIC OF ARGENTINA TO THE UNITED NATIONS, CHAIRMAN OF  
THE GROUP OF 77, AT THE 55TH SESSION OF THE COMMISSION  
ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN  
(New York, February 22<sup>nd</sup> 2011)

Mr. Chairman,

Excellencies,

Distinguished Delegates,

1. I have the honour to speak on behalf of the Group of 77 and China, on behalf of the Group, to extend our heartfelt congratulations to you and other members of the Bureau on your election to the fifty-fifth session of the Commission on the Status of Women. The Group of 77 and China wish to assure you of its full cooperation during the deliberations of this very important session.

Mr. Chairman,

2. This fifty-fifth session is a very special one since it is the first since the establishment of UN-Women. I am proud to express that the G77 and China engaged actively, together with the Non-Aligned Movement and the Joint Coordinating Committee, in the whole process that came out with the establishment of UN-Women. In particular, let me recall the comprehensive and forward-looking document containing concrete and far-reaching recommendations the JCC submitted to the Co-Facilitators of the status of women conference process. The view of G77 and China is unanimous that UN-Women will contribute substantially to a worldwide achievement of gender equality and empowerment of women.

3. In addition, for the sixteen years, the United Nations convened the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing, which adopted the Platform of Action. Despite the progress made so far, challenges and obstacles remain in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcome of the twenty-third special session of the General Assembly. Poverty still constitutes a major challenge for women, especially in developing countries. We continue to account for the majority of children out of school and we are a majority in many of those who are classified as illiterate. Women's health, although improve, several challenges must still be overcome. Violence against women and girls persists in every country and the world. Women still suffer the consequences of conflicts. Women's economic empowerment is still limited by gender inequalities and disparities in economic power sharing. Access to labour markets and to

Women are still underrepresented at senior decision-making levels in all areas. The institutional mechanisms for gender equality and women's empowerment encounter obstacles which impede full implementation of their mandates. Many women face barriers to the enjoyment of their human rights. Stereotyped environmental legislation results in negative effects on the life-style regulation of large and on women in particular. Girls remain particularly subject to different forms of violence.

Peace is inextricably linked to equity and development. Therefore, the international community should give priority attention to the plight of women living under foreign occupation and put an end to their suffering.

Despite significant initial implementation of Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, new tasks and challenges are emerging. In this context, the Group of 77 and China would like to stress the importance of addressing the impact of the global economic and financial crisis, world food crisis and continuing fragility, energy crisis and the challenges posed by climate change on women.

C. The G77 and China stresses the importance of enhancing international cooperation and global partnership for advancing gender equality and empowerment of women, including the fulfillment of its commitments on official development assistance, debt relief, market access, financial and technical support and capacity building.

The G77 and China reaffirms its commitment to the full and effective implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, and looks forward to a productive and successful session.
