

Oral Statement Of The Women Human Rights Defenders International Coalition For The 57th Session
Of The Commission On The Status Of Women

The Women Human Rights Defenders International Coalition, an international group of human rights, women's rights and sexual and reproductive rights organizations, expresses its deep concern over the grave and escalating violence against women human rights defenders, who are targeted in the global South and North alike both because of their gender and their work in defensell human rights.

In our Coalition, we assert that women human rights defenders are both women and also all people who defend genderelated rights. Many people in this room are women human rights defenders, many of us are at risk because of whe are and the rights we focus on. Women Human Rights Defenders are on the frontlines of the struggle to defend women and girls from violence, and are essential stakeholders in preventing and ending it.

We are exposed to genderased violence and other hum rights violations in both the private and public spheres, and our advocacy is challenged by police and family and community members alike. Women human rights defenders who work on sexual and reproductive rights are specifically targeted through harassmet, stigma, discrimination, criminalization and physical violence. This is also true for defenders who are targeted because of their real or assumed identities as women, lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender people.

Justified through tradition, culture ancustomary practice, in contexts of militarization and conflict, fundamentalisms, heteronormativity and globalization, we are targets every day for a range of violations and violence. Our offices are raided, our organizations are shut down, our families are threatened and we are arrested or assaulted because of our advocacy and who we are seen to be.

Knowing the realities of these experiences, we would like to ask: how are all the governments gathered at this year's CSW fulfilling their obligations to protect, promote and fulfill the human rights of women who defend rights against state and netate actor violations and to challenge impunity? In terms of your deliberations, you have an opportunity to make our experiences as defenders of human-rights andwe do not mean only human rights of women isible. We defend all rights, whether those related to food, land and water, or freedom from rape, or rights to peaceful protest or to make independent decisions about our families and reproduction.

Patriarchyand heteronormativity lay the foundation for this systemic violence and the disturbing climate of impunity. These systems of oppression deny women human rights defenders' equality, relegate their lives and work to the private and nomenetized sphere, marginalize their contribution to society, and render many violations invisible or 'insignificant'. States too often do not prevent or punish
