Chairperson,

I have the honor to speak on behalf of the Member States of The Rio Group,  
namely, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay, and Venezuela.

States from our Group have enhanced legal and policy frameworks for the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women including in their national constitutions, by enacting gender equality laws and by reviewing and revising discriminatory laws. Gender equality has also been integrated into national development plans. These plans also address the issue of violence against women and girls.
