



The Golda Meir Women's Center metziah Training Centre, established in 1961 by MASHAV, Israel's Agency for International Development Cooperation, has for decades been engaged in training activities and conferences in the socio-economic arena with an emphasis on gender equality. The Center conducts biennial international women conferences in which prominent women from around the globe review gender issues related to the interaction between development and conflict, and propose for shaping the future of their societies. The most recent conference, held in cooperation with the UN's Office of the Special Adviser on Gender Issues and Equality, was held in October 2009.

Media Monitoring

Media monitoring is a process of systematic collection and analysis of news media content to monitor and evaluate the coverage of specific issues or groups. It involves tracking news stories, identifying key themes, and analyzing the tone and perspective of the coverage. This can help to identify trends, assess public opinion, and inform advocacy efforts.
