Statement by Ambassador WANG Min at the High Level
Committee of the Sixty-sixth Session of the UN General
Assembly on Advancement of Women (Agenda Item 28)

(10 October, 2011, New York)

Mr. Chairman,

The Chinese delegation associates itself with the statement made by Argentina on behalf of the G77 and China.

My delegation welcomes the presentation by Ms. Lakshmi Puri, UN Women Deputy Director and Assistant Secretary-General, on the work of UN Women. Since its establishment, UN Women has carried out effective work in addressing the challenges, to which China would like to express its full support. We believe that UN Women will continue to play a leading role in the field of international women's affairs, maintain the momentum of the global endeavor on behalf of women and push for new progress in this field.

Mr. Chairman,

The Chinese delegation has taken full account of the Secretary-General's initiative on the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action on the outcome of the 23rd Special Session of the General Assembly. We are in favor of the Secretary-General's initiatives of incorporating the enhancement of the economic empowerment of rural women and children into national development strategies and plans and introducing gender perspective in inter-governmental processes. As stated in the Women Strategic Plan 2011-2013, at the threshold of the second decade of the 21st century, the cause of world's women faces both opportunities and challenges. We are encouraged to see that the international community has become increasingly aware of the need for gender equality and women's empowerment. Various multilateral and regional mechanisms have been set up towards this end and many countries are incorporating gender equality into their development strategies. There are more and more outstanding females in politics, economy and academe.

However, it is also the disturbing reality that discrimination against women remains widespread around the world, and family violence and trafficking by women and children continue despite repeated attempts to... problems like the financial crisis, social instability, natural disaster, digital divide and inadequate social service seriously hinder women's development. We still have a long way to go before the full realization of gender equality and women's empowerment.

... and these challenges are not only women's development and effectively elevate their status should be a subject of attention and serious consideration for the United Nations and the international community as a whole. China addresses the priority areas of work identified by UN Women, namely, expanding women's voice, leadership and participation, enhancing women's... and promoting the agenda of women.
