I. Background

On 19 December 2006, the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted without a vote a resolution entitled "Intensification of efforts to eliminate all forms of violence against women" (A/RES/61/143). The resolution requested:

Indicators to measure violence against women have been suggested by different actors, including governmental actors (such as the European Union, Statistics Canada, US Centers for Disease Control-National Center for Inquiry Prevention and Control, and the United Kingdom), non-governmental actors (such as the European Women's Lobby) and entities of the United Nations system (UNECLAC, UNHCR, Secretary-

women in CES countries⁴. Relevant initiatives have also been implemented by several other regional commissions. This expertise and experience should be fully utilized in supporting future work of global intergovernmental bodies in this area.
